

## Understanding Traffic X Suite Steps In A Nutshell

### Week 1 – Getting A Good “Verified MU Host” file. You want your Verified MU Host file to have 100+ good “verified” MU blog hosts.

- 1.** In the first week you will focus on getting a good list of “Verified MU Hosts”. That is your goal. A “Verified MU Host” file is a text file with a list of MU blog hosts that actually allow you to make a blog account on their MU blog.
- 2.** Scout – The first program you will want to run is The Scout. The Scout will find MU blog hosts. You will want to run The Scout for 1 or 2 days before you run any of the other Traffic X Suite programs. You must leave Scout running 24/7 and make sure you do not turn off your computer. **I recommend running The Scout in Google Trends mode at all times.** With Google Trends mode you will never have to load your own keyword file and Scout will continue to search for MU blog hosts 24/7. To activate Google Trends Method scroll down on the Search Method section in Scout. You will not need to load any keywords when using this method. This is an update since the first release of the Traffic X Suite and Traffic X Manual. Please note that just because The Scout finds a MU blog host it does not mean you can sign up for a blog on it. Many MU blog hosts have CAPTCHAS, some will only not permit new users to make blogs, and some will only allow email addresses from their same domain to make blog accounts.
- 3.** Checking Base & Verifier – After you have ran The Scout for 1 or 2 days you will want to start Checking Base & Verifier. During this time you will want to leave The Scout on to keep searching for MU blog hosts. You will want to load your saved MU blog hosts from The Scout into Checking Base. Checking Base basically will go to each MU blog host that Scout found and try to make a blog account on it. It will not successfully create a blog on each MU blog host because, like I said before, some MU blog hosts have CAPTCHAS and others do not permit making blog accounts on them at all. **PLEASE NOTE: When you load your save file from The Scout in Checking Base your saved MU blog host file will be reset and the mu blog hosts found with Scout will be backed up in the C:\Traffic X Suite 2\MU Host Backup\ folder. In doing this, The Scouts stats will reset and it will go back to saying it found 0 blogs. This is normal.** The Scout will just start adding new MU blog hosts it finds to the save file, and it will be named exactly the same. So do not worry when you see Scout saying it found 0 blogs or drop in how many blogs it found. Checking Base does this so when it comes around to “check” the new MU blog hosts that The Scout found it will not have to recheck the MU blog hosts it already checked. **I recommend setting your Wait settings on Checking Base to 15 minutes.** So here is what it does, Checking Base will take your found MU blog hosts found from The Scout, try to make a blog on each of the MU Hosts, then it will wait 15 minutes and grab the new MU blog hosts that Scout found while Checking Base was “checking” and do the process over again.

After you have started Checking Base you will want to start Traffic X Verifier and start it. If Checking Base made a successful blog account on a MU blog host, the host will send you a activation email. Verifier will pick up those emails and automatically activate the blog account. Once, the blog account has been

activated the MU blog host will send you another email with your blog account information email. Verifier will then save your blog account information to your Verifier's saved blog account file you chose. It will also save the MU blog host automatically to a file called Verified Mu Hosts.txt in your C:\Traffic X Suite 2\ folder. Since we know we were actually able to make an account on a MU blog host because it sent us our blog account information, Verifier saves that MU blog host in Verified Mu Hosts.txt file. All the MU blog hosts in that file are good hosts that we know allow us to make blog accounts on. Verifier will also show in its stats how many Verified MU's you have. You will want to watch this stats and move on to the next step when you see that you have 100+ Verified MU Hosts. It should take you a week to collect 100+ Verified MU Hosts if you have a fast internet connection.

## Making Tons of MU Blog Accounts

**4.** Traffic X Base – Once you have 100+ Verified MU Hosts you will want start Traffic X Base. Traffic X Base is basically the same as Checking Base. It makes blog accounts on your MU Hosts. But this time you will load your Verified Mu Hosts.txt file in it instead of your Mu blog host file that Scout made. Traffic X Base will not delete and reset the Verified MU Host.txt file like Checking Base does to the MU blog hosts that Scout find.

**Make sure you set your Traffic X Base Wait Time settings to 10 minutes.**

Now that we know that every single MU blog host in the Verified MU Hosts.txt file is a "good" MU blog host we can actually make an account, you will start making lots of blogs fast when you start Traffic X Base. You will want to leave all the previous programs we were running on. That is The Scout, Checking Base, and Verifier.

Similar to Checking Base, Traffic X Base will make blogs accounts with the MU blog hosts in your Verified MU Hosts.txt file. It will then wait 10 minutes and update the MU blog host file with any new "verified" MU blog hosts that Verifier found while Traffic X Base was making its first round of blogs. This process will continue to go, and go, and go. This will make you lots of blogs in a short time. You will want to watch the Verifier stats and when it shows you have made 10K+ blog accounts, turn of Traffic X Base.

Now, you have a lot of blog accounts to post backlinks to with Traffic X Multiplier. Or you can monetize the MU blog accounts themselves with automated article posters that will post articles to your MU blog accounts that can be monetized while you backlink your sites. Traffic X Suite 2 came with Movie Article Maker which will be updated by the end of Nov. 2009. Movie Article Maker will let you monetize the MU Blog accounts, and let you get the most of your blog accounts, instead of just using it to backlink and rank your sites.

The Ending –

I usually always leave The Scout, Checking Base, and Verifier running. So next time I want to make more blogs I have a fresh list of Verified MU hosts to make blogs with. Every now and then you will have to make new blog accounts as MU blog hosts will go down, or they will do house cleaning and clean up blog accounts already made.
